The Academy unveiled its 2019 Oscar nominations early Tuesday morning, with The Favorite and Roma leading all films with 10 nods apiece.

Both movies are nominated for best picture for the 91st Oscars alongside BlackKkKlansman, Black Panther, Bohemian Rhapsody, Green Book, A Star Is Born and Vice.

Meanwhile, in the directing category, Spike Lee earned his first-ever best directing Oscar nom for BlackKkKlansman, while A Star Is Born director Bradley Cooper was among the snubs, though he did earn a best acting nomination. Lee will vie with Alfonso Cuaron (Roma), Yorgos Lanthimos (The Favourite), Adam McKay (Vice) and Pawel Pawlikowski (Cold War) for the honor of best director at the 2019 Oscars.
